At 8:45 a.m. EMA Director Freet met with the Board to discuss a change order. Since converting to the new 911 system a few issues have been uncovered. Freet would like a programming update for the dispatchers, so they don't have to dispatch using 7 clicks. This would be a one-time license of \$15,000 and would help eliminate human error. Another change would be to purchase external speakers for \$1,500 to eliminate multiple people over talking on dispatchers' headsets. The last change order would be for encryption on radios for \$10,778 in order for West Branch radios to work with Johnson County. Barnhart said that the encryption fee should be RACOM's obligation as they knew Johnson County radios were encrypted since they installed them. Bell said all three issues need to be fixed although we shouldn't have to pay

for the encryptions issue. Sheriff Wethington said he will make it very clear to RACOM on the Board's opinion.

Moved by Sup. Barnhart seconded by Sup. Bixler to approve and authorize Sheriff Wethington to negotiate with RACOM on the change orders to pay for the license and speakers but not the encryption. If RACOM won't negotiate we will pay for all three.
